Re: Patterson Court Housing Summer Usage

As Davidson becomes a more popular place for conferences and camps, there is an increased need for programming space during the summer. Given the historically successful management of the Love of Learning, Tip and July Experience programs along with the imminent roll-out of the Patterson Court renovations, we will increase the use of the Patterson Court houses over the next few summers.

I recently had a meeting with Richard Terry and Kristy Dudley who coordinate the Davidson summer conference programs. The following guidelines for using Patterson Court housing should ensure that this is a mutually beneficial process:

- Conferences/camps/groups will be held responsible for all damages to organization belongings/property. Davidson College will bill the groups for any damages on behalf of the Patterson Court organization, and assist with repairs and/or replacement. A local representative of the Patterson Court organization will be invited to tour his/her facility with a Davidson College conference staff member before and after usage.
- Summer groups will only have access to the large, open 'great room' area. The kitchen, basement and office/chapter room area will be locked and summer groups will not have access.
- The houses will remain locked when not in use by summer groups and will be added to the Campus Police walk-through check-up to ensure they are secured.
- Any 'non-adult' groups will only use the facilities with adult presence.
- As a form of compensation for use of great rooms and organizational furniture, Auxiliary Services will investigate funding on-going Patterson Court-wide improvements such as communal picnic tables, bike racks, cookout grills etc that will benefit all Patterson Court organization members.
