



EVENT/PARTY POLICIES

Below is a summary of some of the Davidson College Alcohol Policy. This summary is by no means complete. Each organization/individual is responsible for being knowledgeable of all aspects of the policy.

FOUR (4) Types of Parties. Any activity, either open or closed, registered or spontaneous, at which alcohol is present shall be considered a party.

1. REGISTERED PARTY. You Need:

- One TIPS trained Risk Manager from outside the sponsoring organization(s) membership.
- One IDer for each point of entry to the event.
- One IDer to control access to the designated serving area.
- One TIPS trained bartender.
- One Police Officer (MINIMUM FOUR HOURS REQUIRED.)

2. MEMBERS ONLY EVENT: Any event that is SOLELY open to members of the organization(s). Police Officer not required. You Need:

- One TIPS trained Risk Manager from outside the sponsoring organization(s) membership.
- One TIPS trained bartender AND one TIPS trained IDer will be required if attendance exceeds 40.

3. MEMBERS AND THEIR GUESTS EVENT: Any event that is open SOLELY to members of the organization(s) and their guests (including, but not limited to date functions.) Police Officer not required. You need:

- One TIPS trained Risk Manager from outside the sponsoring organization(s) membership.
- One TIPS trained bartender AND one TIPS trained IDer will be required if attendance exceeds 40.

4. SPONTANEOUS GATHERING. Absolutely no advertising or prior planning (i.e. "spontaneous"); no larger than 80 people. Must be BYO.

More than forty (40) but less than eighty (80) people, including members, you need:

- Designated TIPS trained Risk Manager to supervise the event.
- To contact Campus Police.

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- **Weekday events/parties must end the service of alcohol by 12:00 midnight and all alcoholic beverages must be removed by 1:00 a.m.**
 - **Weekend events/parties must end the service of alcohol by 1:30 a.m. and all alcoholic beverages must be removed by 2:30 a.m.**
 - **Risk Manager(s), the primary Bartender and the primary IDer must remain on duty for the entire duration of the event/party.**
 - **Members and guests may stay and socialize at the event/party after alcohol has stopped being served so long as the Risk Manager chooses to remain on duty.**
 - **Alcohol may only be served in the designated area that can only be entered by people 21 years old or older. These individuals must be wearing a wristband UNIQUE to that event at that organization.**
 - **Neither IDers, bartenders, nor risk managers may consume alcohol while on duty, nor at least five (5) hours prior to the start of the event/party.**
 - **No one may leave the designated serving area with more than one container of alcohol, that may not exceed 12 ounces in capacity for beer or 5 ounces for champagne or wine, or be glass.**
 - **A supply of food and non-alcoholic beverages sufficient to last the entire event must be provided in the common areas as well as in the designated service area. It is the host organization(s) responsibility to maintain this supply.**
